The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Office for Civil Rights announces a final rule that implements a number of provisions of the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health (HITECH) Act, enacted as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, to strengthen the privacy and security protections for health information established under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA).

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) approved the final rule and subsequently published it in the Federal Register. The Federal Register has published the final Omnibus rules written by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) that will modify the HIPAA Privacy, Security, Breach Notification and Enforcement Rules.

HIPAA Final Omnibus Rule

HHS updated HIPAA and HITECH in 2013 when they finalized the Omnibus Rule. Consequently, Business Associates are now directly liable for any non-compliance and any fines associated with the non-compliance. The update improved patient privacy protections and gave individuals new rights to their health information. The Omnibus Rule finalized:

Omnibus Rule: The Omnibus Rule activated HIPAA-related changes that had been part of the HITECH Act. These included the extension of HIPAA coverage to BAs, the prohibition of using PHI for marketing or fundraising purposes without authorization and new penalty tiers for violations of HIPAA.

HIPAA Omnibus Rule: The Omnibus Rule made several major changes to HIPAA regulation, specifically in regards to the role of BAs. Since the Rule first went into effect in 2013, BAs have been under regulatory obligation to become HIPAA compliant. Additionally, the Omnibus Rule set stricter rules for the execution of Business Associate Agreements, which will be discussed later in this piece.

The Omnibus Rule, in part, expands certain HIPAA obligations to business associates and their subcontractors, modifies the breach notification standard, expands patient rights to access and to restrict disclosure of protected health information (PHI), imposes new rules governing uses and disclosures of PHI, clarifies enforcement approaches, and addresses obligations under the Genetic Information Nondiscrimination Act of 2008 (GINA).

New Omnibus Rule Released: HIPAA Puts on More Weight ...

A major change to the HIPAA compliance rules came in January 2013, when the HHS announced its Omnibus Rule for HIPAA. This rule required that healthcare providers meet certain additional security requirements by September 23, 2013. The maximum fine for a single violation was significantly raised to \$1.5 million.

It used to be that organizations had to provide a notice of a security breach only if the breach posed a significant risk of harm to 500 or more individuals. But under the Omnibus Rule, organizations must report any breach or disclosure of protected health information that is not permitted by the HIPAA Privacy Rule.

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
