Primary lymphedema is a rare, inherited condition caused by problems with the development of lymph vessels in your body. Specific causes of primary lymphedema include: Milroy's disease (congenital lymphedema). This disorder begins in infancy and causes lymph nodes to form abnormally. Meige's disease (lymphedema praecox).
